As a young child, I always wanted to be teacher and wanted to help others; and my role as a trainer will fulfill those goals. During my current professional experience, I learned of a company philosophy, which is "Always Learning, Always Teaching." I feel that philosophy complements with my 'style' well as I am always eager to learn and share my knowledge with others.

While I have not had the chance in the past to continually demonstrate what I have learned in life, I have had the chance to demonstrate all of my knowledge and acquired skills while in graduate school and working my graduate assistantships. My graduate assistantships, which are at Purdue University Calumet and Purdue University North Central, have opened my eyes to teaching and learning with technology. With my knowledge of learning and technology, I plan to integrate this with my training. After I finish graduate school, I will continue my vision as a trainer to implement an a-synchronous training program within restaurants, in an effort to reduce face-to-face training and the labor hours associated with the synchronous training. With my combined knowledge of my undergraduate and graduate studies; I feel I will be able to fulfill my professional vision successfully.

In the service industry, I have been exposed to a massive amount of training and have found that not all individuals are able to train effectively. As a rational and logical individual, I have a compelling drive to understand how things work the way they do and how I can share that knowledge with others. I find that I have a unique style as a trainer.

I notice that I will examine the guidelines or process in front of me, but I will adapt the training to meet the needs of my learners. I feel I need to explain the materials in terms my learner's understand; for if I do not, I will be an ineffective trainer—That bothers me.

An example of meeting the needs of my learners would be in the Office of Instructional Technology (OIT). We worked with professors to transition from Blackboard Vista (WebCT) to Blackboard Learn 9.1. I was instructed to show the professors how to do "X" in Blackboard Learn following specific instructions. After working for several months in the OIT, I found using the instructions I was given was not effective with my learners and after putting the instructions aside, I decided to teach the faculty how to use Blackboard Learn in my own style. My style consisted of assessing the needs of my learner and explaining (teaching) the concept to them in a method where a mutual understanding would be fulfilled. I found many faculty members did not understand how "X" worked in Learn, even though the same exact function was in Vista, but in different terminology. My solution to the problem was explaining how to do "X" in Learn in terms (WebCT/Vista terms) the learner could understand, while incorporating the new terminology in my "lesson" at the same time. While my style was different from the instructions given, I broke no rules, and found in the end—it worked.

I feel the trainer has a dual-role of being a trainer and a leader. My leadership style is similar to the "advocate," whom is known to be very persuasive and articulate (Northouse, 2012). Northouse (2012) notes six key traits in a leader: 1) Intelligence, 2) Confidence, 3) Charisma, 4) Determination, 5) Sociability, and 6) Integrity.

- 5) Confidence- Another educational goal of mine is to improve my confidence before I complete my graduate studies. I feel confidence within an individual is needed in order to be a successful leader in my future profession.
- Charisma- Charisma is something I wish to continually improve on throughout my professional career.
